
#118.00-01-27.100 - Based on the information and analysis of the SEQR concerning this

John mentioned the fun that he remembered at the club and wanted that same thing for the club now, and that is why they decided that they wanted to purchase this property.

classes, hunting and trapping classes. The Morse's have three sons who enjoy hunting, "It's a family thing and that's exactly what we're looking for," John said.

Connie Horner, a Virgil resident said that she supports the reopening of the gun club,

noting that she attended the dances and other events at the former club and that she had taken her hunting safety course there too several years ago. Though she now has COPD she is not able to get out and hunt but she can still come to the club and shoot her guns again, which she enjoys.

The Morse's have received support from other clubs in the Cortland and Tompkins county areas, noting that the McGraw Sportsmen's Club has been helpful in telling them how to start up their club. Gary Davis, president of the McGraw club said that he hoped that they are successful. Davis also mentioned it

County backs new sportsmen's club

The Cortland County Planning Board unanimously supported the project that would reopen a vacant shooting range and sportsmen's club in Virgil.

Located north of the vacant building is Skyline Raceway, on the east side is a residence and Tuller Hill State forest is south and west of the property. Applicants John and Sheila Morse of Virgil hope to use the facility as a members only club and also use the facility for dinners or community fund raisers and other events by the membership. The shooting range will be directed toward the southern

end of the property which borders the state forest.

The County planning board did not have any opposition to the shooting range at the planned location because it was previously used for that purpose. Recommendations were made by the planning board to include extending an earthen wall along the edge of the wooded area to make sure no stray rounds from the shooting range cross onto the state forest land and get consent from nearby residential property owner to permit the use of a firearm within 500 ft. of the property.
